EAAM Membership

Full Member (45 Euro): Limited to veterinarians, biologists, zoo and marine park directors and managers, trainers and husbandry professionals, and others who devote a significant proportion of their professional activities to research, medical care, training, education, and/or management involving aquatic mammals. At least three years of experience in the aquatic mammal field is required to qualify.

Associate Member (45 Euro): Open to any other person having a strong interest in aquatic mammals and not meeting the requirements of a Full Member. Associate Members do not have the right to vote on or hold office on the EAAM Board.

Student Member (30 Euro): Students in a full-time educational program, with an interest in aquatic mammals, may be approved at this level by the EAAM Board for a maximum of six years. Student Members do not have the right to vote or hold office on the EAAM Board.
